

(Re-)Production of Difference in Higher Education and Vocational Training Practice – Focus on Lecturer and Practical Trainers at Universities of Applied Sciences

To what extent are university lecturers at universities of applied sciences and practical trainers involved in the creation or (re-)production of differential relations due to migration and gender? What exactly are the assignments of differences and to what extent are relationships of difference problematized? To what extent can relationships of alterity (othering, practices of acknowledgement and disengagement) or intersectional links be identified?

These questions are investigated by a team from FHNW in the SNF-Projekt 10001A_182378/1, http://p3.snf.ch/project-182378). See attached file for more details.

The data collection of the Zurich Survey of Academics (University of Zurich) is finished.

Approximately 16,000 scientists from Germany, Austria and Switzerland participated in the study. First results on co-authorship and collaboration have been published in "Forschung & Lehre 6/2020" (https://www.suz.uzh.ch/dam/jcr:df689e21-6a17-42a3-9965-3548273c8865/FL.pdf).
